Citizens to Save California ("CSC") has been formed as a general purpose issues committee (FPPC ID 1273022) for the purpose of supporting and/or opposing statewide ballot measures in future elections. Initially, CSC will focus its efforts in support of ballot initiatives that will improve California's economy by aggressively reforming California government. CSC is sponsored by the California Chamber of Commerce, the Small Business Action Committee, the California Business Roundtable, the California Taxpayers' Association, the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association and the California Business Properties Association. Although CSC may support ballot measures that are also supported by Governor Schwarzenegger as part of his reform package, CSC is not controlled by the Governor or his agents, and therefore contributions to CSC are not subject to any contribution limits and can be accepted from any source other than foreign principals. When CSC determines which ballot measures it will support/oppose, it will immediately amend its registration to become a committee primarily formed for or against such measures.

CSC has been formed as a California non-profit corporation (FEIN: 20-2118224) which is exempt from taxation under IRC section 501(c)(4).

Contributions to CSC are not deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes. Notwithstanding that CSC is a 501(c)(4) non-profit, all contributions of \$100 or more will be disclosed on CSC's quarterly filings due April 30th; those contributions from individuals must be accompanied by the donor's occupation and employer information. Contributors to California non-federal committees, including CSC, of \$10,000 or more in a calendar year will trigger their own campaign disclosure obligations. CSC is available to assist contributors, if requested.

Background

In his 2005 State of the State address, Governor Schwarzenegger set forth a historic agenda to fundamentally reform California's political and governmental systems. In his speech, the governor challenged the Legislature to work with him to achieve desperately needed reforms to our political system, our educational system and our system of spending and budgeting. The governor indicated that in the event the Legislature was unable to enact responsible, meaningful reforms, he would ask California voters to enact these reforms through the ballot box.

"Citizens to Save California" is a broad-based committee that has been formed to help address the long list of issues in California that demand reform. It will provide the organizational and financial campaign framework to support potential reforms at the ballot box, as determined by the committee's board of directors.

The Committee

"Citizens to Save California" has been established as a general purpose political action committee with the FPPC. As such, it is currently organized to review and evaluate a number of reform initiatives that have been submitted to the attorney general.

The committee is co-chaired by Allan Zaremborg, president of the California Chamber of Commerce and Joel Fox, president of the Small Business Action Committee. Other members of the board of directors include Jon Coupal, president of the Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Association, Bill Hauck, president of the California Business Roundtable, and Larry McCarthy, president of the California Taxpayers Association. The board of directors will control and determine the activities of the committee, how funds are spent and provide direction and oversight to the committee's consulting team.

A steering committee comprised of major contributors will be organized in the near future. The steering committee will meet periodically to review campaign plans, strategy and tactics, and to provide input, advice and counsel to the board of directors and the consulting team.

the expense of California's families, taxpayers, employees and businesses, and they will aggressively oppose these reforms and spend millions to protect the status-quo. We can't let them succeed.

This is our opportunity to fundamentally reform California's political and governmental systems - an opportunity that we may never see again. We cannot afford to let this slip away. We must support those parts of Governor Schwarzenegger's reform agenda, and other measures, that will put California's economy back on track. We must have the vision and commitment to lead and be prepared, armed and ready to take this battle to California voters.

Please join us in organizationally and financially supporting "Citizens to Save California."

The committee has retained Rick Claussen, of Goddard Claussen, to serve as overall campaign manager for the group. Rick has managed over three dozen successful campaigns, including the "Yes on Proposition 64" campaign this past November to reduce frivolous, shakedown lawsuits and the campaign that enacted Propositions 57 and 58 in March of 2004 (the governor's bond and balanced budget initiatives). Nielsen, Merksamer, Parrinello, Mueller and Naylor, which has represented over 250 ballot measure committees during the past 25 years, has been retained to provide treasurer and FPPC compliance services, and to serve as general counsel to the committee.

In the event that the board of directors determines that the committee should support one or more of the reform initiatives, the committee's organizational statement will be amended to reflect that purpose.

The Reform Agenda

The committee has begun an aggressive effort to review and evaluate a number of potential reform initiatives that have been filed with the attorney general. Among those being considered are the following:

Education Reform

- Fairness for Charter Schools (charter schools)
- Put Kids First (reforming tenure policies for teachers)
- More Money for Kids (assure more education dollars get to the classroom instead of administration, bureaucracy and overhead)

Budget Reform

- Spending Reforms/Deficit Prevention (multiple versions under consideration)
- Protect Governor's Right to Reorganize Government (increases vote requirement to override a gubernatorial government reorganization plan)

Public Pension Reform

- Fair and Fiscally Responsible Public Employee Retirement Account (change from a defined benefit to a defined contribution retirement system for public employees)
- Fair Competition and Taxpayer Savings Act (permits more contracting-out by governmental entities)

Redistricting Reform

- Changes responsibility for redistricting from the legislature to an independent panel (two versions are under consideration)

Other Reforms

- Several other reform proposals have been filed and the committee may decide to review and potentially support one or more of these.

The Process

These various constitutional and statutory measures have all been submitted to the attorney general for title and summary. During the next six weeks, while the title, summary and fiscal impact statements are being developed, the committee will undertake an extensive review and analysis of all the proposals including both qualitative (focus groups) and quantitative (statistically valid public opinion surveys) research.

This research phase will be critical to the overall effort as it will not only tell the committee where we start in the court of public opinion with these measures, but more importantly what arguments work best, major themes that resonate with voters and the most credible spokespersons for our campaign. This and other data will be used by the committee to determine which reform measure(s) the group will support.

Once the title and summary are issued by the attorney general (approximately March 1, 2005) the committee may begin collecting signatures for any of the measures the board of directors determines the committee should support.

While the next regular election to which these measures could qualify is June 2006, the committee will attempt to collect sufficient signatures to qualify for the ballot by the end of April 2005. In the event a special election is called for November 2005, this would likely make the initiatives eligible for a vote on that ballot.

Fundraising and Budget

The committee has set a goal of raising \$13 million in the next eight weeks to fund the legal, organizational, research and qualification activities described above. Given that this effort could include the qualification of multiple ballot measures, the committee has allocated over \$10 million just to pay for signature gathering. The committee will approve all budgets and expenditures to assure that funds are effectively spent.

A memorandum from the committee treasurer is attached which outlines various legal and reporting requirements for contributors. It also contains the information you will need for making your contribution to "Citizens to Save California."

Summary

Governor Schwarzenegger and other leaders from the public and private sector are committed to a healthy and growing economy, getting California back on track, attracting new business and creating jobs. The governor has said that by doing this, we can once again have the revenue to make California's education system the envy of the nation, to build the new roads and infrastructure that we'll need for the 21st century and to fund other essential programs while protecting and enhancing our environment and our quality of life.

Unfortunately, for too long, problem solving has taken a backseat to politics and special interests. The special interests have pursued their self-serving agenda at
